

Introduction

Father's Home Care Ministries is a Christian NGO which seeks to build a sense of belonging among children; particularly orphans, street children and vulnerable children; needy youth to acquire employable skills and single but needy parents in the care of their children as well as widows.

We have been operating for 22 years and have supported about 320 children and youth who have been reintegrated as well as living independent lives. We have supported 10 young people in skills training who are now working and living their independent lives.

The ministry has also supported 6 single mothers in business who can now support their children as well as 27 female prison inmates in learning to make detergents to become independent after serving their prison term.

We have 7 board members and 12 parents who take care of the children and work at the office. The ministry runs 4 departments (Children's Home, Youth Development, School and Farm). The ministry cares for both residential and non-residential children and youth.

Children's Home

The home runs a family system where each family is housed in a 5-bedroom apartment with the children living with either a couple or a single mother. Each family plans their living with the office providing supervisory role.

The residential families with the number of children are as follows:

Youth (Residential & Non-residential)

The home also takes care of 21 residential youth from Senior High School to University who live in 2-bedroom duplex apartments and have parents responsible for their upkeep.

There are also 43 non-residential youth from Senior High School to University who live with their relatives and are supported in their education and are given food items.

Christen, one of the young people living outside the home has gained admission to Offinso Nurses and Midwifery College to read Mental Nursing, which she is excited. Congratulations!!!!! to her as she pursues her nursing dream.

When my father passed away unexpectedly during my 1st year in College, I was devastated. Not only was I grieving, but was also worried about how my family would cope



financially in supporting my education.

My father who was a Fire service officer; was the sole breadwinner and without him, we will struggle in life not to mention of paying my school fees at the tertiary level. I was about to drop-out from school due to the financial challenges I was not going through and with no support from my mother. That was when I heard about a ministry that provided financial support to students in need by my Junior High School teacher called Madam Joycelyn.

I didn't hesitate to reach out to them because I needed help badly. I got Father's Home Care Ministries' address and applied for support explaining my situation and they were incredibly supportive, and understanding. Fish farm


The fish farm is ongoing though there is the challenge of getting quick market. They are still being sold to make way for new fingerlings.
